- To generate excitement about the ICC World Twenty20






The players

Description of Area:

Jaffna is considered to be the capital of the North as well as cultural hub. Under government control for last 15 years of the conflict, the city has stayed relatively intact.

St. Patrick's College is a nationally renowned school for both its academic and sporting achievements. Locate in the center of the town the school is easily accessible and currently accommodates 1000 students, making it the largest venue of the five proposed.

Description of Area:

Kilinochchi is located 30KM from North of Mankulam and was a significant stronghold of the LTTE during the conflict, changing hands between government and insurgent forces throughout the 26 years

Kilinochchi Central school remained open throughout much of the conflict, but had to relocate to temporary accommodation during the final stages of the fighting. Now back to full-time education the students are eager to continue their sports along with studies. Positioned on the A9 road the school is easily accessible from many areas.

Mankulam School

Description of Area:

Positioned on the A9, Mankulam is approximately 40KM of Vavuniya and 30KM South of Kilinochchi. The area was significantly affected during the 26 year civil war.

The Mankulam School was reopened in early 2011 & is the biggest in the region with 500 students in attendance. The school is the only facility to offer 'A' level study in he area and was previously renowned for its sporting excellence

Wicket

Description of Area:

Vavuniya College is located furthest South of the five schools chosen to host the cricket tournaments. The town itself is a hub of activity, acting as the last stop for many going to the North. Although government controlled for much of the final stages of the war, the area was heavily fought over during the 26 years of conflict. Its inhabitants have suffered greatly and are now looking to rebuild their lives.

Description of Area:

Oddusuddan is located within the Mullativu region, but unlike Mankulam, Kilimochchi and Jaffna it is not easily accessible. It therefore is often excluded from aid and the rebuilding effort.

The Mullaitivu region featured heavily in the final stages of the war with significant fighting and many lives lost last in the area. The Oddusudaan school students suffered greatly due to this as their education and everyday life was heavily disrupted, they are therefore desperately need of projects and programs which positively affect their livelihoods.

Boys format

- Four group of three teams each
- Top three from each group qualify for semi finals
- Best runner up amongst three groups will qualify as fourth semi finalist

Girls format

- Two groups of four team each
- Top two teams from each group qualifies for the semi finals

Master class coaching clinics

- One day at each tournament venue
- Coaching tips by hand-picked international cricket stars and Sri Lanka Cricket coaching staff

The legacy




- Participation opportunities for the young cricketers
